RULES FOR ENTRY

MEMBERS ONLY except for **CHILDREN'S CLASSES**, which are open to any child up to and including the age of 14 years and all the **FLORAL ART** classes.

No entry fees or cash prizes- there are small cash prizes in the children's classes.

Exhibits to be staged on the morning of the Show between **8.00 am and 10.45am**The Show area will then be closed for judging.Prize giving at 4pm.

Entries not to be removed until after completion of prize giving.

Judges' decisions are final. Schedule must be adhered to in order to avoid disqualification.

A maximum of two entries per member per class (only one prize to be awarded per member, per class).

Containers in a variety of sizes will be available to exhibitors.

Ebrington and District Gardening Club cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to any exhibitor's property.

Except for floral art classes, ALL exhibits in other classes must be the property of the exhibitor.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITORS

- Flowers for the show should be gathered the day before and immediately plunged into water. Bring spares to the show in case of mishaps.
- With regard to the selection of permitted foliage and number and type of flowers in arrangements – **follow the schedule carefully.**
- You may need crumpled newspaper or kitchen roll to help support flowers (there will be a supply of newspaper available. Also useful are a pair of secateurs or scissors and a small watering can. Flower vases are available for exhibitors.

CLASSES

A silver vase in memory of Miss Stella Elphick will be awarded for most points in the show. A shield will be awarded for the best exhibit in classes 1-17, the Eric Williams Memorial Salver will be awarded for the best exhibit in classes 19-22 and the Peter Satterthwaite cup will be awarded for the best exhibit in classes 23 to 39.

2. 1 vase of THREE large-cupped Daffodils (1 variety)
3. 1 vase of THREE short-cupped Daffodils (1 variety)
4. 1 vase of THREE all-yellow Daffodils
5. 1 vase of THREE all-white Daffodils
6. 1 vase of THREE pink trumpet Daffodils
7. 1 vase of THREE bi-colours (one or more varieties)
8. 1 vase of THREE double Daffodils
9. 1 vase of THREE split-trumpet Daffodils (one or more varieties)
- 10.1 vase of FIVE miniature Daffodils (one or more varieties)
- 11.1 vase of FIVE Daffodils (one or more varieties)

- 12.1 vase of THREE pheasant-eye Narcissi
- 13.1 vase of THREE multi-headed Narcissi (one variety)
- 14.1 vase of THREE Tulips (one or more varieties)
- 15.1 vase of THREE Parrot Tulips
- 16.1 vase of THREE Lily Tulips
- 17.1 vase of FIVE or more Mixed Bulb Flowers (all to be in flower)
- 18.1 bloom of any variety displayed in a bottle
- 19.1 container of GROWING Daffodils (1 variety)
- 20.1 container of GROWING tulips (1 variety)
- 21.1 container of GROWING Hyacinths (1 variety)
- 22.1 container of GROWING spring flowers and/or foliage
- 23. THREE Hellebore blooms floating in a container (1 or more varieties)
- 24. 1 vase of ONE STEM OF SEVEN distinct flowering species, NOT SHRUBS
- 25.1 vase of flowering shrubs, FIVE stems (1 or more varieties)
- 26.1 container of heathers (single or mixed varieties)
- 27. THREE Camellia blooms
- 28.1 vase of THREE Polyanthus or Primula stems
- 29. SIX Pansies/Violas (boxes for staging will be provided)
- 30.1 FLOWERING house plant
- 31.1 FOLIAGE house plant
- 32.1 Cactus
- 33.1 Succulent
- 34.1 Auricula in a pot
- 35.1 pot of Amaryllis

FLOWER ARRANGEMENT CLASSES

(These classes are open to non-members)

- 36. **Pretty as a picture** (not to exceed 40cm x 40cm; No height restriction)
Novice class for those not having gained a first prize in any floral art class
- 37. **A book cover** (not to exceed 40cm x 40cm; No height restriction)
- 38. **Welcome home !** (not to exceed 40cm x 40cm; No height restriction)
